

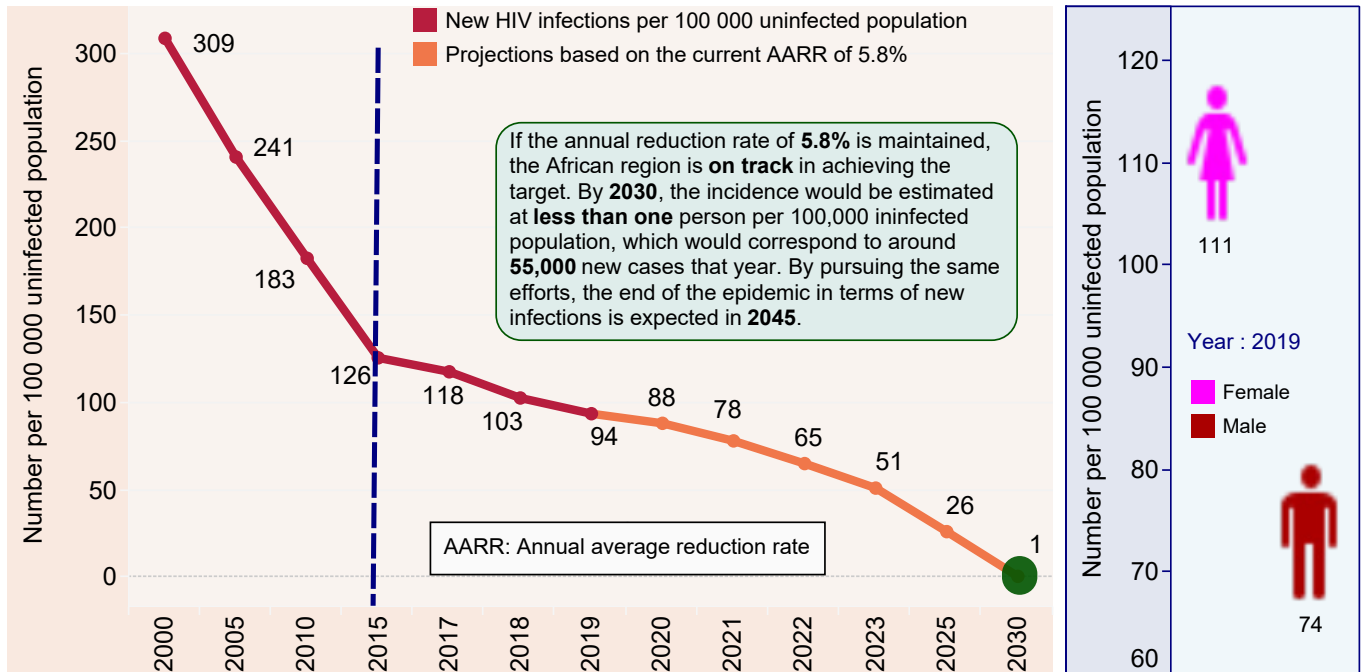

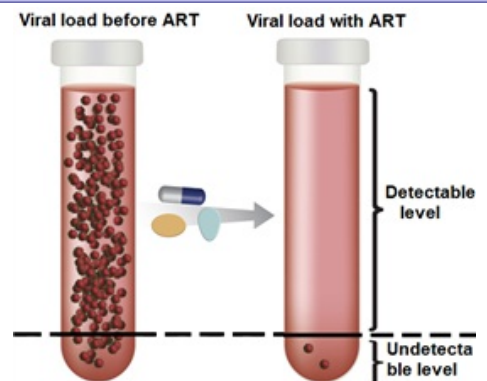


In the African Region, since the beginning of the decade until 2019, **37 million people** have been infected with the HIV virus and about **21 million people** have died of HIV. There were approximately **25.7 million people** were living with HIV at the end of 2019 with **970 000 people** becoming newly infected in 2019.

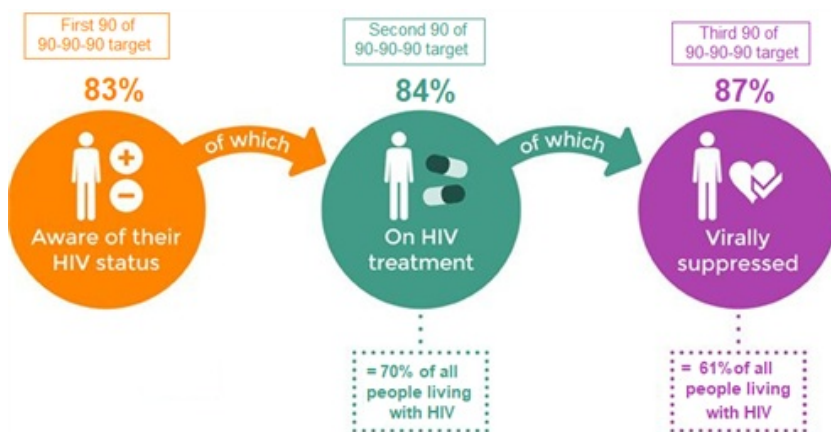
The African Region has made great strides towards achieving the 90-90-90 target over the past five years. In fact, in 2019, among people living with HIV, **83%** (out of the expected 90%) knew their status, an increase of 14% compared to 2015. Then, among people knowing their HIV status, **84%** (out of 90% expected) were on antiretroviral treatment, or nearly 20% of the progress compared to 2015. Finally, among people on ART, **87%** (out of 90% expected) had a suppressed viral load, or nearly 3% increase compared to 2015.

In conclusion, the African Region is on track to reach the 90-90-90 target

Viral suppression

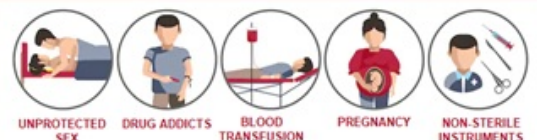


Regional progress towards the 90-90-90 target (all ages), 2019
